They used to be The District. 8 Ι 9 think they are now The waste reduction District, 10 I can use their services for practically nothing 11 to get rid of solid waste.

I have multiple companies, perhaps four or five different private companies vying for my business for waste collection, and they do so at competitive prices. I'm free to select no service if I want.

17 Could you repeat the question? 18 Yes. When you say that the services that you Q 19 now receive are better and cheaper than the 20 services you would receive if annexed, what do 21 you mean? What services are you talking about? 2.2 You've identified Monroe County Sheriff, 23 Monroe County Solid Waste District, four to five 24 businesses vying for your waste collection 25 business. Any other services that come to mind?

Page 17 I believe Monroe County Public Library would 1 Α 2 lose funding if I were annexed. That's a 3 service that myself and my family enjoy. Our fire department would lose funding, I believe, 4 5 if we were annexed, which would further 6 jeopardize my property and my safety. 7 What township are you in? 0 8 Α Perry. 9 Any other services? 0 10 The county does a great job with snow removal, Α 11 with road maintenance. 12 Any others that come to mind? 0 13 А I can't think of any at the moment. If I think 14 of some, I may come back to them. That would be fine. You mentioned the Monroe 15 0 16 County Sheriff provides better service than the 17 Bloomington police department. What do you base 18 that on? 19 They have more officers per population. Α They 20 spend more dollars per population. They have 21 adequate capital facilities right now. The city 2.2 is struggling in finding appropriate home for 23 the police department. The city is struggling 2.4 with hiring and retaining officers. 25 I know in 2021, there was a report that the

Page 18 city commissioned to say that they should have, 1 2 I believe, 121 officers, and at the time they 3 had just over 90. And there's a report that somewhere only around 75 or 76 were available. 4 5 I don't know quite what that means between the 92 number and the 75 number of available. 6 7 Is that the Novak report you're referring to? 0 I do not know the name of it. Indiana Rules of Trial Procedure Depositions Upon Oral Examination Rule 30

(e) Submission to witness--Changes--Signing. (1) When the testimony is fully transcribed, the deposition shall be submitted to the witness for reading and signing and shall be read to or by him, unless such reading and signing have been waived by the witness and by each party. "Submitted to the witness" as used in this subsection shall mean (a) mailing of written notification by registered or certified mail to the witness and each attorney attending the deposition that the deposition can be read and examined in the office of the officer before whom the deposition was taken, or (b), mailing the original deposition, by registered or certified mail, to the witness at an address designated by the witness or his attorney, if requested to do so by the witness, his attorney, or the party taking the deposition.

(2) If the witness desires to change any answer in the deposition submitted to him, each change, with a statement of the reason therefor, shall be made by the witness on a separate form provided by the officer, shall be signed by the witness and affixed to the original deposition by the officer. A copy of such changes shall be furnished by the officer to each party.

(3) If the reading and signing have not been waived by the witness and by each party the deposition shall be signed by the witness and returned by him to the officer within thirty (30) days after it is submitted to the witness. If the deposition has been returned to the officer and has not been signed by the witness, the officer shall execute a certificate of that fact, attach it to the original deposition and deliver it to the party taking it. In such event, the deposition may be used by any party with the same force and effect as though it had been signed by the witness.

(4) In the event the deposition is not returned to the officer within thirty (30) days after it has been submitted to the witness, the reporter shall execute a certificate of that fact and cause the certificate to be delivered to the party taking it. In such event, any party may use a copy of the deposition with the same force and effect as though the original had been signed by the witness.
